Goal Steps: Librarians will have a clear understanding of the district's strategic plan so that they may support student and staff academic needs and to encourage the robust usage of the library's collection of print and digital tools to empower student learners.

- Grow participation in library programs that support literacy and build a connection between the library and the classroom.
- Maintain a diverse and equitable collection of materials in various formats in each building library.
- Maintain and implement programming curriculum maps, pacing guides, and lessons aligned to state standards.
- Empower students as creators using digital tools to independently create products of their learning.
- Provide continuous sharing about digital resources and tools that can support teaching and learning.
- Collaborate with classroom teachers to build student capacity in the area of research skill development and implementation.



Community Partnerships

Goal Steps: The library will continue to build and strengthen community relationships to meet the needs of the school and community.

- Continue to secure needed resources from the public library system to support staff and student learning needs.
- Promote special community events that support literacy, STEAM education, and other events among our staff and students.
- Host in-school or virtual author events in our buildings.



Goal Steps: The library will work within our existing structures to utilize learning flexible spaces and Makerspace materials to promote inquiry, creativity, and authentic real-world problemsolving.

- Ensure all students in grades 4K through 12 have equitable access to check out library materials on a regular basis.
- Ensure libraries are staffed adequately to allow equitable access to e-books, digital books, technology, and other library materials.
- Explore MakerSpace areas for our libraries with a variety of hands-on learning activities for students and staff experiences.

- Build teacher capacity to utilize district technology tools and software to support learning goals and promote digital literacy.

Robust Infrastructure

<u>Goal Steps:</u> Librarians will work in collaboration with the district building teams and the Technology Department to ensure equitable digital access for all staff.

- Develop an equitable distribution of classroom technology and replacement cycles for items including Interactive boards, projectors, document cameras, Chromebooks, and other classroom needs.
- Continue to provide home Internet WIFI connectivity to students in need using hotspots.
- Maintain an accurate inventory of technology items available for checkout.
- Create and maintain efficient processes to check in and check out Library materials.



Budget and Resources

<u>Goal Steps:</u> The library will utilize its common school fund budget to provide an equitable and diverse library collection to meet the needs of staff and student learning.

- Maximize Library funding to maintain equitable, current, relevant and diverse library collections that ensure staff and students access to books in a variety of formats to meet the needs of all learners (e.g. audiobooks, eBooks, Braille, native language, etc.).
- Continue to curate and offer a wide variety of library databases and digital tools to support the learning needs of all students.
- Build collections of materials to support STEAM, Media Productions and other non-print formats.



Data & Privacy

Goal Steps: Librarians will advocate and promote best practices for student and staff data privacy.

- Utilize a district materials adoption process that includes Student Data Privacy parameters.
- Engage with vendors to ensure that the assigned privacy policy is on file for all software that has access to Personally Identifiable Information (PII).
- Continued teaching digital citizenship skills to support student online safety, privacy, and security.
