UW Oshkosh-Fox Cities Campus Closing

We may have discussed UW Oshkosh-Fox Cities Campus as an option during Junior Conferences. In summer of 2025, this campus site will be closing and no longer available. Students who were considering UW Oshkosh-Fox Cities as part of their post-secondary plan will need to reconfigure their path.

Direct Admit to UW System Universities

All incoming seniors have received notice of the Direct Admit program NEW this year. This process eliminates the need for students to fill out an application, pay application fees, and be responsible for sharing their transcript with the following institutions:

All incoming seniors who did not opt out will be receiving a letter in their Skyward messages center that will state which UW schools they have been accepted to. The Wisconsin Guarantee

Incoming seniors who are in the top 10% of their graduating class will also be eligible for the *Wisconsin Guarantee*. The Wisconsin Guarantee offers guaranteed admission to all Universities of Wisconsin (UW) universities for all who qualify. First-year applicants from Wisconsin high schools who are in the top 10% of their class at the end of 11th grade are guaranteed to all UW universities except UW-Madison. You will need to apply to UW Eau-Claire and UW La Crosse separately as they are not a part of the Direct Admit program.

Additionally, first-year applicants from Wisconsin high schools who are in the top 5% of their class at the end of 11th grade will be guaranteed admission to UW-Madison provided that they apply on or before the Early Action deadline. You will need to apply to UW-Madison as they do not participate in the Direct Admit program.

FHS will be administering the PSAT on Wednesday, October 16th. Cooperative Academic Partnership Program (C.A.P.P.)

At this time, Freedom High School is running the following CAPP Courses next year.CAPP College Writing 101CAPP American Literature 214CAPP Spanish Intermediate Structure and Expression 204CAPP Biology 105

Enrolling in the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Cooperative Academic Partnership Program (CAPP) courses are a convenient and affordable way for high school students to earn concurrent high school and college credit, while developing key skills for future success. CAPP students pay less than half the standard per-credit tuition rate with the cost based upon the number of credits assigned to each class. It may also reduce the amount of tuition paid when you get to college because of the courses you can transfer (meaning fewer classes you have to take in college!)

If your child indicated that they were planning on taking a CAPP course next year, please review the link below for details on payment due dates.

The cost for a CAPP credit CAPP (Cooperative Academic Partnership Program) is \$105 dollars per credit. CAPP Writing 101 and English 214 would be \$315, \$420 for CAPP Bio and CAPP Spanish will be \$525. Cost per credit at UW Oshkosh is \$324.82 for a Wisconsin resident.

The first item that ALL future CAPP students need to complete is to APPLY to UW Oshkosh. Many students already attended the application meetings held in April. If a future CAPP student has NOT applied to UW Oshkosh as a CAPP student, they *must do so immediately*. Students need to reapply every year they take a CAPP course. Students taking CAPP Writing 101 should have taken the English Placement exam. Students were personally notified of this through several emails and during the CAPP meetings that took place this past spring. After a student applies to UW Oshkosh as a CAPP student, they will receive an email from UWO after applying that provides you with a net ID and password. Please activate and follow the directions/link below.

Students will need approximately 90 minutes to take the English Placement Test. Students should do it all in one sitting in a quiet place and on a laptop/chromebook (not their phone).

College Credit in High School Courses through UWGB (CCIHS)

Freedom High School is running the following College Credit in High School Program (CCIHS)-UWGB Math Courses in 2024-2025:

College Credit Precalculus:	Math 104, Precalculus
College Credit Calculus:	Math 202, Calculus and Analytic Geometry

Enrolling in the University of Wisconsin Green Bay College Credit in High School program courses are a convenient and affordable way for high school juniors and seniors to earn concurrent high school and college credit, while developing key skills for future success. Students pay less than half the standard percredit tuition rate with the cost based upon the number of credits assigned to each class. It may also reduce the amount of tuition paid when you get to college because of the courses you can transfer (meaning fewer classes you have to take in college.)

The cost for a CCIHS credit (College Credit in High School Program) is \$105 dollars per credit. Math 104 and Math 202 would be \$420.

Payment is due October 3rd 2024 for: students taking a CCIHS Course in Terms 1 and 2 Payment is due February 6th 2025 for: students taking a CCIHS Course in Terms 3 and 4 Payment should be brought to the FHS Counseling office and checks can be made payable to "FHS."

The core of the program will always remain the same – we are here to educate, engage and save lives. There will be a parent component as well and information is forthcoming.

In National Honor Society, students learn to plan and carry out different activities preparing them for the future. Under the advisement of Mrs. Hauser, NHS members become a part of a group of students who support each other and have fun supporting those outside of their normal groups. In the past, they have worked on tie blankets for various organizations in the area, food drives for the Freedom Food Pantry, yard clean-up for the seniors and disabled members of the community, and participated in the Polar Plunge.

Another item to note is that there is an organization with the initials NSHSS (National Society of High School Scholars) that sends out mailings that is NOT affiliated with the school. This is an entirely different organization that charges a membership fee.

In late summer, prior to the start of the school year, a letter will be sent to all incoming juniors with a cumulative GPA of 3.67 from Mrs. Hauser regarding the application process.
